- 4 imperatives (commands in light of what is true)

6:1-11

looks back ... only 1 imperative (v.11)

6:12-14

4 commands based on what God has done already!

6:15-23

looks forward to a glorious outcome based on your current reality.

Doug Moo: [Living in sin] is not possible, as a constant situation, for the one who has truly experienced the transfer out from under the domain, or tyranny, of sin. Sin's power is broken for the believer, and this must be evident in practice.

John Murray:

"As surely as Christ rose from the dead, so surely shall we walk in newness of life."

Douglas Moo: “To stop engaging in those sins that have too often become so habitual that we cannot imagine not doing them – is a daunting responsibility. We feel that we must fail.
