Romans 7 Listening Sheet

Romans 7 has three main sections under the broad heading of Sanctification and the Law:
I. Believers have to the Law (vv.1-6)
Change of! w/ New fruit or spiritual offspring
 Important distinction: Sin doesn't die, we die to it Law doesn't die, we die to it.
But what does it mean to die to the Law?
1) You have Died to its power. Romans 8:1
2) You have Died to its power.
II. This is important because sin uses the holy Law to produce sin (vv. 7-13)
Expositor's Bible Commentary: "Sin is a mighty force man cannot tame, but which lurks dormant or relatively inactive in a person's life, then is brought to the fore by prohibition and proceeds to rise up and slay its victim, whom it has utterly deceived."
III. And because the believer's is with sin, not God's (vv.14-25).
Two Interpretation Options:
1. Paul as an prior to his conversion to Christ. Moo: "I do not, then, deny that Christians struggle with sin – I deny only that this passage describes that struggle."
2. Paul as a, mature Christian of 22 years. Matthew Henry: "Paul speaks like one that was sick of it, that would give anything to be rid of it the remainders of indwelling sin are a very grievous burden to a gracious soul."
