1 Peter 3:15 but in your hearts honor Christ the Lord as holy, always being prepared to make a defense to anyone who asks you for a reason for the hope that is in you; yet do it with **gentleness** and respect,

Titus 3:2 to speak evil of no one, to avoid quarreling, **to be gentle**, and to show perfect courtesy toward all people.

Col. 3:12 ¶ Put on then, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, compassionate hearts, kindness, humility, **meekness**, and patience,

gentleness (Strongs G4240) πραΰτης prautēs

Webster's Dictionary - **Gen'tle·ness**, *n*. The quality or state of being gentle, well-born, mild, benevolent, docile, etc.; gentility; softness of manners, disposition, etc.; mildness.

Gentleness includes the quality of mildness, which is seen in a willingness to submit to the will of God. It implies a submissive and teachable spirit toward God that manifests itself in genuine humility and consideration toward others. It can be understood as humble submission to God, but here (Gal 5:23) it has the primary sense of gentleness and patience in dealing with others. It has the meaning of humility, courtesy, or considerateness in relating to others.
