# **GOD THE FATHER:**

We teach that God the Father, the first Person of the Trinity, is the Creator of all things (Genesis 1:1-31; Ephesians 3:9)

As the absolute and all-powerful Ruler of the universe, He is sovereign over creation, redemption and the consummation of all things (Psalm 103:19; Romans 11:36; Ephesians 1:3-14).

Why was earth the focal point and Adam and Eve the pinnacle?

#### In Redemption in general:

## In Consummation of the Messianic Kingdom:

SEE Isa. 11:1-5

His fatherhood involves both His designation within the Trinity and His relationship with humanity in general but especially His relationship with believers. As Creator, He is Father to all people (Acts 17:28-29), but He is a spiritual Father only to believers (Romans 8:14; 2 Corinthians 6:18; Ephesians 3:14-15; 4:6).
