Outline for Week 13 - Mk 11:27-13:37

Main Truth: Jesus is the Messiah who will judge and save when He returns.

1) Warnings to Religious Leaders Mk 11:27-12:12

Principle: Jesus judges people who reject His authority.

Application Questions: What biblical truth am I refusing to believe? What is my response to God's beloved Son, Jesus Christ? What truth in Scripture have I understood but rejected?

2) Charges Against Religious Leaders Mk 12:13-44

Principle: The Messiah is both God (David's Lord) and man (David's Son).

Application Questions: How would an audit of our checkbooks reveal our faith & obedience? How does my knowledge of Jesus give me delight and cause me to worship Him? Am I giving to God sacrificially or out of my "leftovers"?

3) Signs the End is Near 13:1-37

Principle: Earth & humanity are hurtling toward Christ's return.

Application Questions: What am I doing to spread the gospel to all parts of the world? How am I living today as though Jesus might come any moment? What am I doing now to prepare and warn a lost world for His coming?

- 1. In the parable of the vineyard owner, who did the various characters represent? What was the Jewish response to this story by Christ?
- 2. What was the trap the question concerning taxes was attempting to try and get Jesus to fall into? What do you think his answer tells us?
- 3. How do you "render to Caesar the things that are Caesar's"? What would that mean for us today?
- 4. What was Jesus' amazing response to the question about the resurrection?
- 5. Why do you think the poor widow caught Jesus' eye? What message was Jesus attempting to convey to his disciples through this incident?
- 6. How well are you living out the great commandment? What does it mean to love God with your heart, soul, mind, and strength?
- According to Jesus what worldwide events will happen during the tribulation? What can followers expect of Christ during that time? How does Jesus describe his second coming in Mk12:24 - 27?
- 8. Take a look at Matthew 24:44 51. What does this passage in Matthew suggest will be the results of an eager watchfulness to the promised return of Christ or of a careless indifference?
- 9. What do you think it means to watch for Jesus' return? Read 1 Thessalonians 5:1-11. What does this passage from Paul add to your understanding of the end time events?
- 10. Read 2 Peter 3:10-13. Given the certainty of future events described in this passage and in the others that you have read, how believers should live in the present day?
- 11. Do Jesus' words about the end times comfort you? Or worry you?
