Douglas Moo: To stop engaging in those sins that have too often become so habitual that we cannot imagine not doing them – is a daunting responsibility. We feel that we must fail. But Paul then reminds us of just what we have become in Jesus Christ: "dead to sin, alive to God." There has already taken place in the life of the believer a "change of lordship" … and it is in the assurance of continuing in this new state that the believer can go forth boldly and confidently to wage war against sin."
