

## More Resources on Science, Creation, Intelligent Design, and Evolution:

### Perspectives on Science

- David Berlinski, *The Devil's Delusion: Atheism and Its Scientific Pretensions*. Gives a devastating blow to the irrational assumptions made by atheistic science.
- Thomas Kuhn, *The Structure of Scientific Revolutions*. This book rocked the scientific world in 1962 and continues to have an impact today. Shows how science is extremely biased, being tied to certain philosophical presuppositions that prevent it from considering counter-evidence to its theories.
- John C. Lennox, *God's Undertaker: Has Science Buried God?* Lennox is a brilliant professor of mathematics at Oxford University. He shows that by no means has modern science buried God.
- Nancy Pearcey and Charles B. Thaxton, *The Soul of Science: Christian Faith and Natural Philosophy*. A tour de force on the history of science and its roots in a Christian worldview and how modern science has lost its bearings.

### Intelligent Design

- Michael J. Behe, *Darwin's Black Box: The Biochemical Challenge to Evolution*. The book that introduced the modern Intelligent Design movement and rocked the evolutionary world.
- Guillermo Gonzalez and Jay W. Richards, *The Privileged Planet: How Our Place in the Cosmos Is Designed for Discovery*. A remarkable book that shows planet earth is so finely tuned for life that it could only come from the hand of a supremely intelligent Creator.
- Phillip E. Johnson, *Darwin on Trial*. Another important book on the advent of the Intelligent Design movement and how it caused a breach in the supposedly unbreakable dam of Darwinian Evolution. Darwinists have been on the defensive ever since.
- Stephen Meyer, *Signature in the Cell: DNA and the Evidence for Intelligent Design*. Stephen Meyer is one of the most brilliant minds in the Intelligent Design movement today. This book explores one of the most remarkable proofs for an intelligent Creator.

### Young Earth Creation

- Terry Mortenson and Thane H. Ury, *Coming to Grips with Genesis: Biblical Authority and the Age of the Earth*. The best scholarly book to date on the subject of how to interpret Genesis and its plain view of creation in six days in light of modern science and theology. Challenging read but not too difficult.
- Douglas F. Kelly, *Creation and Change: Genesis 1.1-2.4 in the Light of Changing Scientific Paradigms*. The best comprehensive defense of six-day creation as it walks through Genesis 1 and 2 from an exegetical, theological, and philosophical perspective. The book convinced R. C. Sproul to believe in a six-day creation.
- John Harnett and Alex Williams, *Dismantling the Big Bang: God's Universe Rediscovered*. Demonstrates the serious shortcomings of standard Big Bang cosmology that is even accepted by a majority of Christian scholars. Shows how a Biblical cosmology cannot interpret the evidence for an expanding universe with the Big Bang theory's naturalistic presuppositions.
- John D. Morris, *The Young Earth: The Real History of the Earth – Past, Present, and Future*, Revised and Expanded ed. One of the best overviews of how young earth creationism interprets the scientific evidence to support a plain reading of Genesis.
